Explore tuition, finances and scholarships.

Your university education is an investment in your future. We want to help you understand the cost of studying at Laurier with information on tuition, scholarships and awards. Tuition rates are set each year for new, incoming international students. Once admitted, tuition rates for continuing international students will increase by no more than 5% between years of study.*

**Students who change their undergraduate program during their studies will be subject to the tuition fees for their new program, which may exceed a 5% increase.*

ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

All applicants are automatically assessed for a renewable entrance scholarship and it is awarded based on your final high school admission average. *No application required.*

IN-COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS

After your first year, you are automatically assessed for in-course scholarships based on your grade-point average (GPA) in your previous academic year at Laurier. *No application required.*

INSPIRING LIVES SCHOLARSHIPS

\$1,000 – \$5,000: Awarded each year to multiple international students. This scholarship is awarded to students who inspire lives of leadership and purpose and is not based on academic achievement.

In 2025, we awarded 41 scholarships to students from 16 countries.

COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIPS, BURSARIES AND AWARDS

\$250 – \$5,000: Apply for competitive scholarships, awards and bursaries every year by submitting a student profile. Awards are based on the information provided in your profile and are awarded throughout the academic year. *Application required.*

Student profiles open in the summer.

All international scholarships require students to pay international tuition fees. Students who are exempt from international tuition are eligible for domestic entrance and in-course scholarships.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Apply with confidence.

Applying to university can feel overwhelming, especially if you're considering a new country! To help you feel confident as you apply to Laurier, **here's what you need to know.**



You'll use the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) website to apply and accept your offer.

Curriculum information.

We accept all curriculums for admission consideration. You will need to meet all curriculum-specific requirements to be considered for admission.

AMERICAN CURRICULUM

- High school graduation.
- Passing grades in six courses at the honours, Advanced Placement (AP) or senior level required for admission.
- ACT and SAT scores not required. Test scores may be requested of homeschool applicants.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

- We accept AP courses completed in either grade 11 or grade 12 of your curriculum as a part of our assessment.
- You may receive transfer credits (up to six courses or 3.0 credits, depending on the program) for AP exams at a minimum grade of 4.



BRITISH PATTERN EDUCATION

- We require five unique courses with at least two at the A-level or equivalent to what is specified below.
- Two AS-level courses may be substituted for one A-level course.
- Three GCSE subjects, or two when three A-level subjects are presented.
- You may receive transfer credits (up to six courses or 3.0 credits, depending on the program) for A-level courses with a final grade of B or higher.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

- IB Diploma including six subjects, of which three must be at the higher level (HL).
- If you are taking IB courses along with another curriculum, your application is assessed based on your entire academic record.
- You may receive transfer credit (up to six courses or 3.0 credits, depending on your program) for HL courses with a final score of 5 or higher, and if Theory of Knowledge and Extended Essay each have a final grade of B.

ONTARIO CURRICULUM (OSS)

- Six 4U/M courses are required for assessment including a 4U English.
- Required courses are used in the admission average calculation for some programs as indicated in the admissions chart.
- If you are taking OSS courses with another curriculum, your application is assessed based on your entire academic record.

ENGLISH-PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

You are required to provide proof of English proficiency if you have not studied in an English-language curriculum for a minimum of three years. When you send your test score to us, you can **use Laurier's institution code: 0893.**

TRANSCRIPTS AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

We will email you to say what transcripts and documents are required to assess your application. You will upload these documents directly in your applicant portal. Don't miss out on important updates—be sure the email address you use for your OUAC application is one you check regularly.

Laurier reserves the right to request that official documents be validated through World Education Services.

TUITION DEPOSITS

We require a tuition deposit from all international students. The deposit is not an additional fee and the amount of your deposit will be applied to your first-term tuition balance. Please submit your tuition deposit only after you have accepted your offer to Laurier.

PROVINCIAL ATTESTATION LETTERS

All international students applying to university in Canada need a provincial attestation letter (PAL). We will issue your PAL once you accept your offer and pay your tuition deposit. You will include your PAL with your study permit application.

STUDY PERMITS

You need a study permit that contains Laurier's designated learning institution (DLI) number (O19395164307) to study in Canada. We can support you with your study permit application. If your study permit application is approved, depending on your home country, you will receive either a Temporary Visitor Visa (TRV) or Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA). These are the authorizations that allow you to travel to Canada.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

September 2026 Admission

- Apply by **April 1, 2026**.
- Submit your required documents by **May 12, 2026**.
- Accept your offer of admission by **June 1, 2026**.

January 2027 Admission

- Apply by **Nov. 22, 2026**.
- Submit your required documents by **Dec. 1, 2026**.
- Accept your offer of admission by **Dec. 11, 2026**.

How to apply and next steps.

Here's more information about **applying to Laurier** and **what you need to know** at each stage in the process.

1 Get ready to apply.

You can **apply to up to three programs** at Laurier. As you choose your programs, be sure to review:



- The specific requirements for each program.
- The admission requirements for your curriculum.
- If you will need to provide proof of English proficiency.

2 Submit your application.

To **ensure your application is ready** for assessment, you'll need to:



- Submit your application through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).
- Gather the required documents for your application.
- Access your Laurier applicant portal, which will be available after you apply through the OUAC.
- Upload documents as part of the supplementary application, which you will find in your applicant portal.

You will need to upload documents for each program you apply to.

3 Support your application.

Enhance your application and provide additional information related to your academics:



- Submit the Applicant Background Summary (ABS) form, which you can find in your applicant portal. If your average is below the required minimum, this form could help you gain admission.
- Complete the Special Case and Extenuating Circumstances form, which you can find in your applicant portal. This is a personal statement where you can disclose any recent or present circumstances that have impacted your ability to achieve a strong academic standing.

4 Receive an admission decision.

Once we have all your **required documents**, we can begin assessing your application:



- We will make a decision on each program you've applied to at Laurier.
- An admission decision is made within two to four weeks but may take longer for competitive programs.
- We will email you when we've made a decision which will be visible in your applicant portal.
- We will assess your application for your preferred program. If you don't meet the requirements for that program, you will automatically be considered for admission to an alternate program.
- We may use wait lists for competitive programs. If you are placed on a wait list, you will also receive an offer of admission to an alternate program.
- Your offer will likely be conditional and you will have to clear any conditions on your offer by the deadline listed on your offer letter.

5 Accept your offer.

This is the **really exciting part**: accepting your offer to Laurier! When you're ready:



- Accept your offer through the OUAC.
- Pay your tuition deposit.
- Look for your PAL in your applicant portal after accepting your offer and paying your tuition deposit.
- Submit final, official documents that are needed to clear the conditions of your offer.

IB REQUIREMENTS: All required courses must be HL or SL at a minimum score of 3.
